What do Fifth Grade Students Learn in the Library?

When your child goes to the library during his/her scheduled Library class time, the skills and activities they will be practicing includes:

Literature Appreciation

Compare and contrast various genres of literature including:

- realistic fiction
- science fiction
- historical fiction
- informational
- biography
- memoir
- science fiction
- fantasy
- poetry
- mystery

Demonstrate active listening and speaking through booktalks

Draw and share conclusions about the theme or focus of a work

Able to choose an appropriate book to read for pleasure and enjoyment

Book Location / Library Citizenship

Understand information on an OPAC record (Online Public Access Catalog)

Understand the 10 divisions of the Dewey Decimal System

Use information from an OPAC record to locate a book

Understand and demonstrate proper book care

Demonstrates appropriate use of all library materials including technology

Demonstrate use of shelf markers

Demonstrate appropriate behavior in the LMC (Library Media Center)

Able to check out library materials independently

Research

Uses background information to brainstorm ideas

Writes questions that lead to inquiry

Uses multiple sources of information including print and nonprint resources

Evaluates multiple sources of information for relevance, usefulness, and accuracy

Uses various note taking strategies (outlining, highlighting, underlining, bulleted lists, and graphic organizers)

Forms opinions and uses evidence from texts to prove support them

Assesses and revises own work with guidance

Interprets information from maps, charts, diagrams, photographs, and other visuals

Determines important details

Organizes information effectively

Cites all sources used according to model provided by the teacher

Digital Citizenship

Practices online safety by protecting privacy

Demonstrates social responsibility by respecting intellectual property and citing online sources

Demonstrates appropriate online behavior including respecting others online

Evaluates digital sources for accuracy

Recognizes the ability of the media to inform, persuade, and to entertain

Identifies responsible use and misuse of technology

Demonstrates proper use and care of all technology equipment
