What do Fourth Grade Students Learn in the Library?

When your child goes to the library during his/her scheduled Library class time, the skills and activities they will be practicing includes:

Literature Appreciation

Compare and contrast various genres of literature including:

- realistic fiction
- science fiction
- historical fiction
- informational
- biography
- science fiction
- fantasy
- poetry
- mystery

Demonstrate active listening and speaking skills through booktalks

Draw and share conclusions about the theme or focus of a work

Able to choose an appropriate book to read for pleasure and enjoyment

Book Location / Library Citizenship

Understand information on an OPAC record (Online Public Access Catalog)

Understand general Dewey Decimal System order

Use information from an OPAC record to locate a book

Understand and demonstrate proper book care

Demonstrate use of shelf markers

Understand basic sections of the LMC (Library Media Center) and resources located in each

Demonstrate appropriate behavior

Able to check out library materials independently

Research

Uses an inquiry based model of research to build understanding

Generates key words for a research-based project with guidance

Asks questions to clarify topics or details

Selects and uses multiple appropriate print and nonprint resources to answer questions

Evaluates multiple sources of information for relevance, usefulness, and accuracy

Uses various note taking strategies (outlining, highlighting, underlining, bulleted lists, and graphic organizers)

Understands the basic concept of plagiarism

Paraphrases and summarizes information that answers research questions

Uses skim and scan to locate information that is appropriate at age and ability level

Interprets information from maps, charts, diagrams, photographs, and other visuals

Determines important details

Organizes information effectively

Assesses and revises own work with guidance

Digital Citizenship

Practices online safety by protecting privacy (e-mail, files, passwords, etc.)

Demonstrates social responsibility by respecting intellectual property and citing online sources

Demonstrates appropriate online behavior / netiquette

Evaluates digital sources for accuracy

Demonstrates proper use and care of all technology equipment
